## Team Managers

Team Managers (including coaches and chaperones) requiring access to poolside must purchase a Poolside Accreditation pass in advance of the event via the registration portal if they are not competing themselves.

## Lost or Forgotten Accreditation Passes

A £10 charge will be applied on all lost or forgotten wristbands if a competitor arrives at the event without their accreditation.

Accreditation checks will be carried out at the event and entry into the event may be denied without the accreditation wristband.

## Clear Deck Policy

We will be operating a clear pool deck policy, and therefore require all competitors and coaches to sit upstairs in the spectator balconies when not competing or using the warm up and swim down facilities.

Please make your way down to the pool deck **four heats** before you are due to race and you must return to the balcony once your race or swim down is complete.

Access to the deck can be made through the changing village.

You must follow the instructions of the Field of Play volunteers. Non-compliance will be reported to the management team and in such cases the swimmer may be excluded from the competition.

## Warm Up and Swim Down

Warm up will take place in the competition pool prior to each session and will last 50 minutes. Warm up and swim down facilities will be available throughout the competition. Please check the notice board for which pool will be in use for warm up during each session as it may change as the competition pool is used for other sports.

Training lanes will be available on the afternoon of Saturday 24 June 2023. For health and safety you must book in advance to help manage the number of users. Booking is free and you can book a group at once.

## Marshalling & Call Room

The Call Room is located on the opposite side of the pool to the timing suite and will be signposted. You should only arrive at the Call Room within four heats of your race. Please stay at the side until the heat before yours has started.

**Please Note: Should you miss your heat for whatever reason, you will not be able to swim in a later heat.**

## Swimwear

Swimmers are reminded that to qualify for a national, regional or World Masters record their swimwear must be compliant with the World Aquatics requirements.

## Records

Whilst we aim to identify all World, European and British Records which are broken during the competition, it is the ultimate responsibility for each athlete to claim a record. If you set a record and it is not announced, please inform the Resolution Desk as soon as possible. All records will be checked by the Resolution Desk.

## Starting Blocks

There will be a full set of starting blocks in the competition pool. These are the "track-start" design. Backstroke ledges will be available; however, they do not need to be used if you are not comfortable doing so.

## Relay Team Declaration

Relay Team declarations need to be made using the online form.

Please be reminded that all swimmers in relay teams must have registered to participate at IGLA London 2023. Swimmers not registered will not be allowed to swim.

## Exhibition Relays

Relays are always a fantastic event to be a part of and cheer along. To help everyone enjoy that thrill we will be hosting a series of exhibition relays aimed at allowing solo attendees, those who are not part of a club already and swimmers not already in relays to come together and compete. Exhibition events will not count toward medals or club points but are fun events to embrace the spirit of the championships. Entry will be £5 per swimmer and sign up will be over the warm up of the session till the close of the first event of that session. Full details will be published at the championships.

## Withdrawals

To ensure that the meet runs efficiently it is essential that those not intending to swim inform the withdrawal desk as soon as possible.

Advanced withdrawals should be made before 23:00 BST on 20<sup>th</sup> June 2023 online via the withdrawal form.

After June 20<sup>th</sup> withdrawals must be made in person by completing an official withdrawal form no later than 30 minutes before the advertised starting time of the warmup in each session.

Once withdrawn participants may not be re-entered. In line with the General Athletic Terms refunds are not issued for withdrawn events.

### Re-entry for 1500m:

Competitors entered in 1500m Freestyle events are required to confirm their intention to swim in these events by re-entering at least 60 minutes before the start of the sessions in which that event will be swum.

## Team Managers Briefing

A Team Managers Briefing will occur 30 minutes before the start of the first session each day in the Officials Lounge. We advise at least one Coach/Team Manager attend these session to support their swimmers.



## Medal Presentations

Medals shall be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each age group for each event

Medals will be available to collect from the Awards Desk approximately half an hour after the race. The swimmer will need to provide their name, club and event at the medal desk in order to collect it.

Please collect your medals early, session by session. Do not leave them all till the end.

## First Aid

First Aid services will be available at the Championships. Pool staff will administer first aid where necessary. If medical assistance is required, please approach the nearest Championship Crew volunteer or member of London Aquatic Centre staff, who will contact a first aider.

### Entrance to LAC

All competitors will be asked to arrive & depart at the top entrance of the London Aquatics Centre on the side of the centre closest to Westfield Shopping Centre. (The opposite side to the London Stadium)

You are not permitted to use the main public entrance on the waterfront.

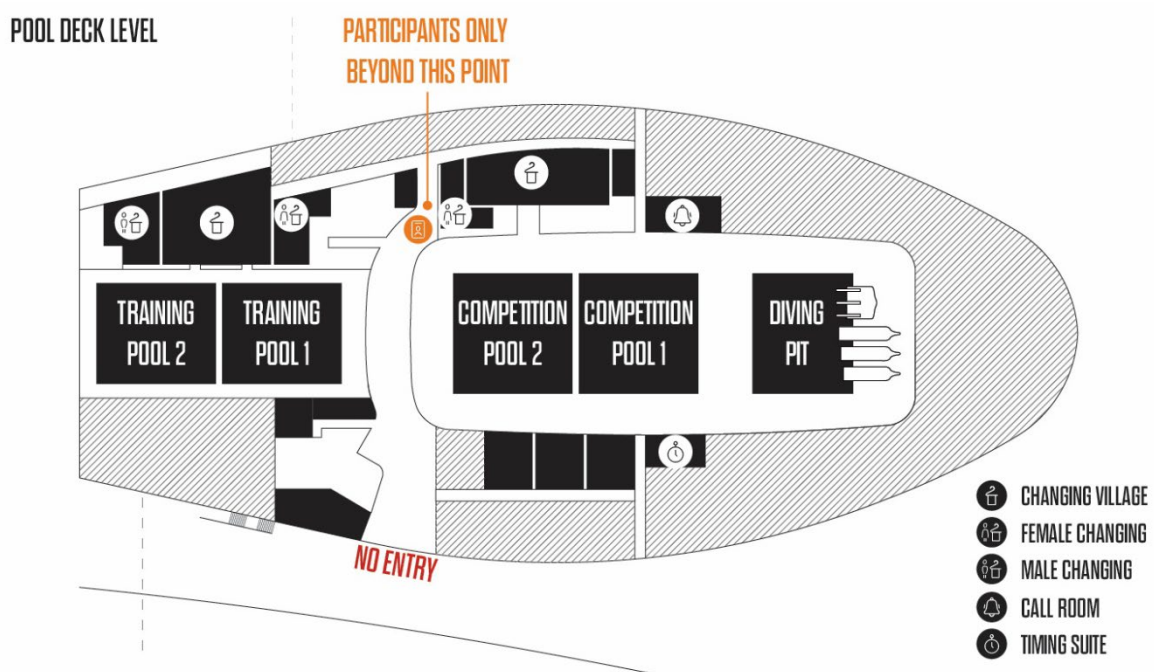

## Access on Saturday 24th & Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> June

The London Stadium will play host to MLB World Tour: London Series 2023 over the weekend of the 24 & 25 June 2023. Expect the Olympic Park and Public Transport to be exceptional busy throughout the day. Participants are advised to plan their travel accordingly.

## Pool Names

All swimming events will be taking place in Competition Pool 1 (CP1). Warm up and swim down facilities will be available throughout the Championships however they may be located in different pools. Please check the notice board for which pool will be in use for warm up during each session as it may change as the competition pool is used for other sports.



## Lockers

Lockers are available for participants in the changing villages and can be operated via returnable £1.00 coin.

There are no lockers available for spectators and guests.

## Water Fountains

Water fountains are available in the changing villages for both the training and the competition pool.

## Catering

There are two coffee stands at either side of the spectator balconies providing a selection of hot & cold food, drinks and snacks.

**Please note that card payment only is accepted.**

## General Meet Conditions

### 1. MEET ADMINISTRATION

- 1.1. **Meet Promoter:** Richard Walton ([richard.walton@london2023.org](mailto:richard.walton@london2023.org))
- 1.2. **Meet Administrators:** Michelle Weltman ([headcoach@outtoswim.org](mailto:headcoach@outtoswim.org)),  
Hannah Soltz ([hannah.soltz@london2023.org](mailto:hannah.soltz@london2023.org))
- 1.3. **Lead Referee:** Jeanette Edmiston
- 1.4. The competition will be held under FINA Rules, Swim England laws and technical rules of swimming.
- 1.5. The meet will take place at the London Aquatics Centre between Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> and Friday 30<sup>th</sup> June 2023. The pool is a 10 lane, 25 metre facility fully equipped with electronic timing, display board and anti-wave ropes. Limited parking is available. The closest tube station is Stratford.
- 1.6. Officials will be qualified or in-training officials enrolled with a FINA-registered national governing body. Attending clubs are asked to provide one licensed official to assist with the running of the event. Please email [headcoach@outtoswim.org](mailto:headcoach@outtoswim.org) with details of any official or trainee official who is available.

### 2. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 2.1. The meet is held under the IGLA London 2023 General Athletic Terms and Conditions.
- 2.2. This Open Masters and Senior Age Group Meet shall include multi-classification events and be conducted Short Course under Swim England Laws, Regulations and Technical Rules of Swimming, the relevant World Para Swimming Rules and these Promoter's Conditions.
- 2.3. The event conditions may be revised in response to guidelines from the Operator, Government and Public Health England related to COVID-19 and sporting competitions. The event itself may be operated under an agreed COVID mitigation plan which all participants will be required to agree to as part of an opt in to the meet.
- 2.4. In the interests of safety, to keep the event within the available time booked at the hosting facility and to ensure the smooth running of the Meet, Out to Swim reserves the right to restrict the number of entries in any given event.
- 2.5. With the specific exception of official photographers appointed by IGLA London 2023, flash photography is prohibited during race starts.
- 2.6. A continuous warm up and swim down facility will be available in the unused half of the main competition pool. This facility is shared with participants in all aquatic disciplines of IGLA London 2023. Coaches are responsible for supervising their swimmers when using this facility.

- 2.7. No persons, unless officials, staff, coaches or team managers displaying a valid accreditation pass, shall be allowed on poolside. Accreditation must be worn at all times inside the venue within accredited areas.
- 2.8. Participants are advised not to leave their belongings unattended and to ensure that valuables are placed in a secure locker or deposited with someone for safe keeping. IGLA 2023, Out to Swim and the pool management will not be held responsible for property that is damaged, lost or stolen.

### **3. DATA PROTECTION**

- 3.1. We will process personal data submitted by the swimmer or their club in accordance with the current Privacy Notice published by London IGLA 2023 CIC. With respect to this meet we will process personal data for the legitimate purpose of running the gala. The items of personal data processed are name, Swim England number, date of birth, sex, and para-swimming classification (if applicable). During the gala we will process name, sex and competition age in reports for the legitimate purpose of running the gala efficiently. At the end of the gala, we will process name, sex, Swim England number and date of birth in the electronic submission made to British Rankings, IGLA and to any FINA-registered National Governing Body of the competing clubs. We may also share the full results of the meet, excluding the dates of birth of swimmers, with the competition secretaries of those clubs taking part.
- 3.2. After the gala the personal data processed will be stored securely in both document and electronic formats for 12 months and then erased. This period of storage permits the accurate response to enquiries about the gala and provides statistical information for the purpose of designing the following year's gala. No personal data will remain on any electronic timing systems used to run the gala. You have the right to have your personal data erased from our systems if you have withdrawn from the gala. You also have the right to object to the processing of your personal data. In both cases, please make your request to the promoter.

### **4. ELIGIBILITY FOR ENTRY**

- 4.1. Swimmers must be registered with either:
  - 4.1.1. Swim England as "Club Compete" (Cat. 2) competitor, or
  - 4.1.2. Another FINA-registered National Governing Body.
- 4.2. In line with the General Athlete Conditions international participants should take care that they have the correct permissions to compete abroad. By signing up you are confirming that:
  - 4.2.1. Your home nation's FINA-registered National Governing Body has granted you permission or a permit to compete abroad.
  - 4.2.2. You have taken out sufficient insurance to cover you in the event of an accident, illness or incident. You understand that you are not covered by Swim England insurance.
  - 4.2.3. You have completed a risk assessment and will inform the meet administrator ([headcoach@outtoswim.org](mailto:headcoach@outtoswim.org)) if you require any measures to enable you to compete safely.
- 4.3. UK and international swimmers who are not registered with an eligible club can pay a fee of £15.70 to use the Swim England Temporary Membership scheme.
- 4.4. A competitor must be a registered member of the club in whose name they are entered at the closing date. A competitor may only compete for one Club in the competition.

- 4.5. All para swimming participants must have an authorised IPC Swimming, British Swimming, INAS-FID or British Blind Sport classification, which is held on the British Swimming or IPC Swimming classification database at the time of entry.
  - 4.5.1. Participants whose classification is not held on this database must submit evidence of their classification to the Lead Referee no later than one month prior to the first day of the competition.
  - 4.5.2. Participants with no para swimming classification who require an exception to the rules must be in possession of a valid Certificate of Exception and this must be presented to the referee prior to the start of the relevant session.
- 4.6. All events have upper cut-off times.
- 4.7. Participants must have equalled or bettered the upper cut-off times. This can be timed by a coach or from a previous event at any level including unlicensed events.
- 4.8. By submitting an entry to this Meet, a competitor attests to the fitness and ability of the competitor to complete the event without foreseeable injury or incident and without causing delay to the event schedule.

## 5. AGE AND GENDER CRITERIA

- 5.1. Age Groups swum in the meet will be:
  - 5.1.1. Seniors: 18-24 (years old)
  - 5.1.2. Masters: 25-29; 30-34; 35-39; 40-44; 45-49; 50-54; 55-59; 60-64; 65-69; 70-74; 75-79; 80-84; 85-89; 90-94; 95-99; 100-104; 105-109 and so on at 5-year increments as necessary.
- 5.2. Combined age relay teams permitted in the meet will be:
  - 5.2.1. 100-119 (years old); 120-159; 160-199; 200-239; 240-279, 280-319; 320-359.
- 5.3. A swimmer's age shall be determined as at midnight on 31st December 2023 except "seniors" who should have achieved their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before the first day of the competition.
- 5.4. IGLA actively welcomes swimmers of all sexual and gender identities. The competition is open to trans, non-binary, lesbian and gay athletes and their allies. Any participant may register for the women's, non-binary or men's events. No proof of identity is required. Medals will be awarded for each of three categories: male, female, open. Results uploaded to Swim England or your relevant FINA association will be reported based on the sex registered with your governing body.

## 6. EVENTS

- 6.1. There will be team and individual events as set out in the draft Schedule of Events document that accompanies these conditions. Events may be moved between sessions and days in order to accommodate as many Participants as possible and you should check the updated schedule regularly.
- 6.2. All heats will be swum by entry time, incorporating swimmers of all ages and genders.
- 6.3. All events will be Heat Declared Winners. Results will be published by age and gender.
- 6.4. **Over the top starts may be used for all events**, although this is at the referee's discretion.



- 6.5. **Swimmers must remain in the water** until directed to leave by the referee. They are to leave the pool using the steps at the side of the pool and must not climb over the electronic timing pads at the end of each lane.
- 6.6. A secondary strobe for deaf swimmers (S15) will be available.

## 7. ENTRY FEES AND PROCEDURE

- 7.1. To enter this competition you must register through the main IGLA London 2023 registration portal and pay the requisite fees in accordance with the published conditions. Registration can be completed via [www.london2023.org/register](http://www.london2023.org/register)
- 7.2. Entries will only be valid with an entry time. Entry times submitted should be those achieved in a 25m pool. Converted long course times and short course times from another pool length will be accepted providing they have been converted using Swim England Equivalent Performance Tables.
- 7.3. In all cases the first 50 Participants from each continent of the world shall be guaranteed a place in up to 5 events. Thereafter events are offered on a first come, first served basis.

## 8. MEET PROCEDURE

- 8.1. All participants who have had their entry accepted will be assumed to be in attendance and **MUST** formally withdraw if they are not able to compete. This allows reserve candidates to be offered a space.
- 8.2. All events shall be heat declared winner.
- 8.3. Start sheets for the heats will be posted on-line and will not be provided at the meet.

## 9. ARRIVAL AND WITHDRAWAL SYSTEM

- 9.1. Individual participants are not required to check in each session but **MUST** register on arrival at the competition and check the updated heat allocation at the start of each session.
- 9.2. All Relay Teams must be checked in by the team manager no later than 50 minutes before the start of the warmup in the session in which the relay takes place.
- 9.3. Participants (or their representatives) who are not intending to swim must inform the meet administrator. Withdrawals can be submitted:
  - 9.3.1. Online by 23:00 GMT on 20 June 2023 Withdrawal Form,
  - 9.3.2. At the Withdrawals Table at the pool by completing an official withdrawal form no later than 50 minutes before the advertised starting time of the warmup in each session.

## 10. RE-ENTRY

- 10.1. Competitors entered in 400m Individual Medley and 400m, 800m and 1500m Freestyle events are required to confirm their intention to swim in these events by re-entering at least 60 minutes before the start of the sessions in which the events will be swum. The deadlines for re-entry will be published in the Competitor Information Pack

## 11. MARSHALLING

- 11.1. It is the participant's responsibility to report to the Competition Stewards in the designated Marshalling area in good time for your event. Heat start lists for each event will be posted on-line before each session starts and it is the participant's responsibility to ensure their name appears on the list prior to the start time of the session.

- 11.1.1. **Heat allocation is likely to change owing to withdrawals so check at the start of the session.**

- 11.1.2. **Events may move between sessions prior to the start of the competition to allow us to accept as many entries as possible. Check your schedule on arrival.**

- 11.2. Upon entry to the Marshalling area, the participant must ensure that they report to a Steward and be registered as being present. Participants must follow the directions of the Competition Stewards at all times.
- 11.3. All participants must enter the Marshalling area 'race ready' as under normal circumstances having entered the Marshalling area they should remain in its confines until directed onto the pool deck for their race.
- 11.4. Coaches/chaperones will not be allowed in the Marshalling area at any time.

## **12. COACHES, CHAPERONES AND PERSONAL CARE ATTENDANTS**

- 12.1. All coaches, chaperones and personal care attendants who wish to be on deck/poolside during the event must have a valid pass.
- 12.2. Passes must be applied for via the registration system in advance of the championships. at a cost of £15. Payment will be taken at the point of booking the pass.
- 12.3. Personal care attendants are only permitted for para swimming participants where assistance is permitted on their code of exceptions. Such attendants will be excluded from any restrictions and will be given the same accreditation as the participant for whom they have personal care responsibilities.

## **13. RESULTS AND AWARDS**

- 13.1. Participant's times will be computer processed. These results will then be displayed both on poolside and online. Following the meet, all results will be sent to Swim England to be included on their Masters rankings list, to IGLA and to any FINA-registered National Governing Body of the clubs which have entered.
- 13.2. The first, second and third fastest swimmers in each age category (see condition 5.1) in each event shall be awarded medals.
  - 13.2.1. There shall be no official presentation of medals. Medals will be available for personal collection from the Presentation Desk subsequent to the publishing of the official results for each event.
  - 13.2.2. An "Award-Winner's Photo Stand" will be available for winners to take a personal photo with their medal
  - 13.2.3. Medals not collected during the meet will not be made available subsequent to the meet.
- 13.3. Medals for para swimmers will be awarded on a multi-classification basis and will be allocated to the top three BPS points scorers in each event in each age category separately.
- 13.4. IGLA Championships are a team-scored event. The IGLA Team Championship winner shall be awarded to each of the Large, Medium and Small team (in

accordance with the published IGLA rules) whose swimmers gain the most points as set out below:

13.4.1. Individual points awarded by order of finish: 11 - 9 - 8 - 7 - 6 - 5 - 4 - 3 - 2 - 1

13.4.2. Individual point values shall be doubled for relays.

13.5. Winners of the IGLA Championships Large, Medium and Small Team categories must be IGLA member teams in good standing prior to the commencement of the competition.

13.5.1. The definition of “good standing” means they are currently an IGLA member team, registered with the IGLA Secretary, and with dues paid.

## **14. PROTESTS**

14.1. Any protest shall be determined by the a panel made up of:

14.1.1. Meet director or their representative;

14.1.2. Representative from the IGLA Board;

14.1.3. Representative from the IGLA Championship Rules Committee;

14.1.4. The lead referee; and

14.1.5. One other official not involved in the dispute.

## **15. SPECTATORS**

15.1. Spectators are very welcome to IGLA. In order to assist with the costs of running the event spectators will be asked to make a donation of £5 to Out to Swim (registered charity number 1181454).

15.2. Hard copy programmes may be available for a nominal fee of £3.00. However, we reserve the right to make electronic versions available free of charge in replacement for all hard copies.

15.3. Flash photography is prohibited during race starts. Use of any form of image capturing devices in the changing area is prohibited and may result in exclusion from the event.
